1. Govt Sets up FRBM committee on fiscal deficit range

- ❖ The Union Government has constituted a five member committee to comprehensively review and give recommendations on the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM) road map for the future.

2. India successfully test fires its indigenously developed Prithvi-II missile

India has successfully blasted off its indigenously developed nuclear capable Prithvi-II missile as part of a user trial by the army from a launch complex-3 of the Integrated Test Range (ITR) at Chandipur in Odisha.

- ❖ The Missile have a strike range of 350 km also capable of carrying 500 kg to 1,000 kg of warheads and is thrustured by liquid propulsion twin engines also ninemetre-tall. It uses advanced inertial guidance system with manoeuvring trajectory to hit its target.
- ❖ DRDO developed Prithvi is India's first indigenously-built ballistic missile.

3. World's largest Single Rooftop Solar Power Plant inaugurated in Amritsar

World's largest single rooftop stretch of 42 acre solar power plant of 11.5 Mw capacity was installed in India

- ❖ It was inaugurated by New & Renewable Energy Resources Minister of Punjab Bikram Singh Majithia at Beas in Punjab.
- ❖ Mandalay Bay Resort Convention Centre, Las Vegas in the United States is next biggest solar photovoltaic power station

4. Trial run of Delhi Metro's new 'driver-less' train begins

The country's first driverless-metro train was tested on track in the capital, equipped to run on Unattended Train Operations mode.

- ❖ The train was flagged off by Urban Development Minister Venkaiah Naidu and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal at new Mukundpur depot.
- ❖ The trial run started at the Mukundpur depot and ended at Majalis Park station on the Majlis Park-Shiv Vihar corridor.

5. Govt opens Tatkal window for faster patents to startups

Union government has opened a Tatkal window to fasttrack patent proposals. Start-ups by new applicants that fills the criteria allowed to use this route for obtaining faster clearances.

- ❖ By March 2018 the government also plans to significantly cut down the time period for granting of patents to one-and-a-half years from the existing five to seven years.
- ❖ This makes entities can choose the fast track for obtaining patent by paying additional fees if • they select India as International Search Authority or International Preliminary Examining Authorities and file their applications in India first.

v. The application fees for individuals and start-ups have been kept at Rs 8,000 while for companies, it could be as much as Rs 60,000.

6. Associate banks to merge with SBI

Country's largest lender State Bank of India has planned to merge its five associate banks and also to merge Bharatiya Mahila Bank. All six are state owned.

- ❖ The five associate banks have a collective advances base of Rs.3.78 trillion and a deposit base of Rs.5.03 trillion.
- ❖ While the BMB was created in 2013 by the UPA government, particularly to cater to women's lending needs based in Delhi.
- ❖ The Banks to be merged with the SBI are,
 1. State Bank of Bikaner and Jaipur,
 2. State Bank of Hyderabad,
 3. State Bank of Mysore,
 4. State Bank of Patiala,
 5. State Bank of Travancore,
 6. Bharatiya Mahila Bank Limited.
