INTERNATIONAL

1. Rank of India Improves in International Tourist Arrivals

As per the UNWTO definition, International Tourist Arrivals (ITAs) comprises two components namely Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) and Arrivals of Non-Resident Nationals.

- The UNWTO in its barometer ranks countries in terms of their ITAs.
- So far only the figures of FTAs were compiled in India. However, now India has started compiling the data arrivals of Non-Resident Indians (NRIs), also.
- As per the latest UNWTO Barometer for March 2017, Rank of India in International Tourist Arrivals in both 2014 and 2015 is 24 as against the previous rank of 41 and 40 in the year 2014 and 2015, respectively.

2. Jordan's Azraq refugee camp becomes first to run entirely on solar energy

A refugee camp in Jordan has become the first in the world to be powered by renewable energy.

- About 20,000 Syrian refugees living in the desert camp of Azraq will be able to use electricity generated by a solar plant.
- The new \$9.6m two-megawatt solar plant was built by the Ikea Foundation's Brighter Lives for Refugees campaign and is expected to save \$1.5m a year, which the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees will be able to use to improve sanitation, shelters and organise activities around the camp.

3. International Museum Day: 18 May

International Museum Day (IMD) is an international day a celebration that held every year on 18 May, coordinated by the International Council of Museums (ICOM).

- The theme of International Museum Day 2017 is "Museums and contested histories: Saying the unspeakable in museums".

4. Finland to Host 2017 Arctic Energy Summit

Finland has agreed to host the 2017 Arctic Energy Summit as the first major event of their Arctic Council Chairmanship, which runs 2017 to 2019.

- The Arctic Energy Summit was last held in Fairbanks in 2015.
- In Finland, the Summit will build on past work, highlight the Finnish Chairmanship and 100th Anniversary.
- The Summit will take place at Finlandia Hall, 18-20 September 2017.

5. Jaipur Literature Festival kicked off in London

The Jaipur Literature Festival was inaugurated in London to present a sumptuous showcase of South Asia's literary heritage, oral and performing arts, books and ideas, dialogue and debate.

- The British Library, the second largest library in the world by number of items catalogued, played host to the annual festival as part of the wider UK-India Year of Culture celebrations.
- Indian High Commissioner to the UK Yashvardhan Kumar Sinha opened the two-day events proceedings at the world-famous library.

6. International Day for Biological Diversity: 22 May

The International Day for Biological Diversity (or World Biodiversity Day) is a United Nations-sanctioned international day for the promotion of biodiversity issues. It is held on May 22.

- The International Day for Biological Diversity falls within the scope of the UN Post-2015 Development Agenda's Sustainable Development Goals.
- Theme for the year 2017 is "Biodiversity and Sustainable Tourism".

7. World Metrology Day: 20 May

World Metrology Day has become an annual celebration since the Meter Convention was signed by representatives of seventeen countries on May 20, 1875.

- The convention set the framework for international collaboration in the science of measurement including its industrial, commercial and societal applications.
- The theme for World Metrology Day 2017 is "Measurements for transport".

8. India Ranks Third Highest Globally In Internal Displacement Numbers: Report

Nearly 2.4 million people in India were internally displaced due to conflict, violence and disasters in 2016, the third highest number globally, a new report by a UN monitoring centre said.

- The Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre and the Norwegian Refugee Council released a new report which ranked India third among countries most affected by displacement related to disasters followed by China and the Philippines.
- It said that conflict, violence and disasters caused 31.1 million new internal displacements in 2016.

- The highest displacements were recorded in China with 7.4 million people getting impacted, followed by the Philippines (5.9 million), India (2.4 million) and Indonesia (1.2 million).

9. India becomes second largest steel producer

India overtook Japan to become the second-largest steel producer in the world after China in 2016, according to data released by the International Stainless Steel Forum (ISSF).

- India's stainless steel production rose to 3.32 million tons for 2016 showing an impressive growth of about 9% over 3.0 million tons achieved in 2015.

10. Petroleum Minister co chairs India OPEC Institutional Dialogue at Vienna

The Minister of State (I/C) for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan visited Vienna, Austria to co-chair the 2nd India-OPEC Institutional Dialogue at the OPEC headquarters.

- The meeting took place two days prior to the OPEC Ministerial meeting that is scheduled from 25th May.
- Pradhan held a one-to-one meeting with the Secretary General of OPEC Mr Mohammad Sanusi Barkindo.
- It was agreed that India will host the next meeting during 2018.

11. 3rd RCEP Inter-sessional Ministerial Meeting

Commerce and Industry Minister Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman led the Indian delegation to the 3rd Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) Inter-sessional Ministerial Meeting on 21-22 May 2017 in Hanoi in which Trade Ministers of 15 other RCEP countries participated.

- Trade Minister and Industry Minister of Philippines Mr Ramon Lopez, was the Chair of the Meeting as Philippines is currently holding the Presidency of ASEAN this year and Minister of Industry and Trade of Vietnam, Mr Tran Tuan Anh, as the host extended a warm welcome to the delegates.
- So far 4 Ministerial Meetings, 3 Inter-sessional Ministerial Meetings and 18 Rounds of the Trade Negotiating Committee at the technical level have been held.

Points to Remember

- Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) is a proposed free trade agreement (FTA) between the ten member states of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) (Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam) and the six states with which ASEAN has existing free trade agreements (Australia, China, India, Japan, South Korea and New Zealand).
- RCEP negotiations were formally launched in November 2012 at the ASEAN Summit in Cambodia.

12. Japan to build war museum in Manipur

Japan is going to build a war museum at the hillock at Maiba Lokpa in Bishnupur district, Manipur, where a Japanese camp was located during World War II.

13. Nepal PM Prachanda resigned

Nepal Prime Minister Pushpa Kamal Dahal 'Prachanda' has resigned paving way for Nepali Congress President Sher Bahadur Deuba to become the next Prime Minister.

14. Tajmahal among top 10 global landmarks

Taj Mahal, the magnificent monument of love, has made it to the top 10 landmarks in the world by securing fifth position in the list.

- One of the most iconic wonders in the world, the Agra-based imposing white marble structure, a tourist delight, is the only Indian monument to figure in the world's top 10 Travellers' Choice awards for Landmarks.

15. Indians issued maximum work visas to UK in 2016

Indian nationals were issued the maximum number of skilled work visas to live and work in the UK last year, according to statistics released.

- Indians accounted for 58 per cent of the total skilled work visas granted last year -- 53,863 of a total of 93,566.
- Americans were the second largest community with 9,255 visas.

16. Mumbai, Kota among world's most crowded cities

Two Indian cities - Mumbai and Kota - have been named among the world's most crowded in a list topped by Dhaka, said the World Economic Forum (WEF), citing UN-Habitat data.

NATIONAL

17. India to host annual meet of AfDB

PM Narendra Modi will inaugurate the annual meeting of African Development Bank (AfDB) on May 23 at Gandhinagar.

- It is the first time in the history of AfDB Group that India will be hosting the annual meetings.
- The core theme of the event is "Transforming agriculture for wealth creation in Africa".
- The meetings will be held from May 22 to 26.

18. National Anti-terrorism day: 21 May

The National Anti Terrorism Day is celebrated every year on May 21 in India to raise awareness among all sections of people, about the danger of terrorism, violence and its dangerous effect on the people, the society and the nation as a whole.

- On this day, in 1991, the former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi was assassinated by a suicide squad of Liberation of Tamil Tigers Eelam (LTTE), while attending a rally in Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu.

19. Turbo Megha Airways first private airline to get UDAN licence

Turbo Megha Airways has become the first private airline to get a licence to fly under UDAN, the government scheme for subsidized regional flights.

- Turbo Megha Airways which is also called TruJet, is one of the five operators who have been awarded a total of 128

routes under the UDAN scheme.

- The airline will use three ATR-72 aircraft, and will add more planes later.

20. Bengaluru Airport to Go green

The Bangalore International Airport Limited (BIAL) inaugurated solar farms at the Kempegowda International Airport premises.

- The first project of 440kW has been installed in the car park area in front of the BIAL corporate office, and the second project of 2.5MW solar panels at the airside.
- Both projects - jointly - will reduce carbon emission by 3125 tonnes per annum (3075 tonnes of carbon dioxide emission per annum at the airside and 550 tonnes at the car park area).

21. Woman from Arunachal becomes first to scale Mt Everest twice within 5 days

A climber from Arunachal Pradesh, Anshu Jamsenpa, scripted history by scaling Mt Everest twice within five days.

- Jamsenpa, a mother of two, had conquered the world's highest peak for the fourth time on May 16.
- Jamsenpa set the world record for becoming the first woman climber to reach the top of Mt Everest twice within five days.
- She is also the first Indian woman to reach the top of Mt Everest for the fifth time on May 21.

22. PM Narendra Modi lays foundation stone for 993-crore projects of Kandla port

Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for half a dozen projects worth Rs 993 crore related to development of Kandla port.

- The projects for which foundation was laid include a convention centre named after Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar.
- Modi also suggested that the Kandla Port Trust be named after Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay, who stood for the uplift of all sections of the society.
- Other projects include two cargo berths, a road over bridge, deployment of two mobile harbour cranes and mechanisation of fertiliser handling facility at the port.

23. Exhibition on 'Return of the three stone Sculptures from Australia to India'

Dr. Mahesh Sharma, Minister of State (I/C) for Culture and Tourism inaugurated an exhibition "Return of the Three Stone Sculptures from Australia to India" in National Museum, Janpath New Delhi.

- The exhibition is organised to mark the safe return of three stone sculptures (Seated Buddha, Worshippers of Buddha, Goddess Pratyangira) from Australia to India.
- These sculptures were purchased by National Gallery of Australia from the Nancy Wiener, New York in 2007 and Art of the Past, New York, 2005.
- The Minister released a book entitled 'War Paintings of The Irresistible Jat King Surajmal' by Dr Satya Vrata Tripathi and also launched an 'App on Swachhta Abhiyan'.

24. Piyush Goyal launches 'SEVA' App

Union Minister of State (IC) for Power, Coal, New & Renewable Energy and Mines, Piyush Goyal launched the Saral Eindhyan Vitaran Application (SEVA), developed in-house by Coal India Limited (CIL) for power sector consumers.

- SEVA is a part of 'Digital India' initiative, which is aimed at increasing the Consumer Connect as well as the Transparency and Accountability in Coal dispatch.

25. Govt approves abolition of Foreign Investment Promotion Board

The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has given its approval to the phasing out of Foreign Investment Promotion Board (FIPB).

- The proposal entails abolishing the FIPB and allowing administrative Ministries/Departments to process applications for FDI requiring government approval.
- Henceforth, the work relating to processing of applications for FDI and approval of the Government thereon under the extant FDI Policy and FEMA, shall now be handled by the concerned Ministries/Departments in consultation with the Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion(DIPP), Ministry of Commerce, which will also issue the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for processing of applications and decision of the Government under the extant FDI policy.

26. Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports to Initiate "Adopt A Slum" Campaign in Delhi

Minister of (Independent Charge), Youth Affairs & Sports, Shri Vijay Goel announced "Adopt a Slum" - a new campaign to mark completion of three years of the Government.

27. In Maharashtra, 'Good Morning' Squads To Monitor And Prevent Open Defecation

The Maharashtra government has decided to form 'good morning' squads to monitor and prevent open defecation in villages and districts across the state.

28. BSNL launches satellite phone service

State-owned BSNL has started satellite phone service through INMARSAT which will be initially offered to government agencies and later opened for others citizen in phased manner.

29. Construction Of India's First Underwater Rail Tunnel Finishes

Boring of India's first underwater rail tunnel running under the Hooghly river has finished before its scheduled deadline of July.

- The tunnel is 16.6kms, 10.8kms of which runs underground. And of 10.8kms, 502 metres under the water and the whole thing connects Howrah to the west and Salt lake to the east.
- It will have 12 stations and six will be underground. Estimated cost of the entire project is Rs 5,000 crores.

30. Government launches 'e-Sanad' for digital attestation of documents

- 'e-Sanad', an initiative of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), in association with two other ministries -- will initially be hosting school leaving certificates with the help of Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).

31. IIT-KGP signs MoU with MP for measuring happiness

IIT Kharagpur's Rekhi Centre of Excellence for the Science of Happiness has signed an MoU with Madhya Pradesh government to collaborate on the development of a Happiness Index for measuring the well-being of the people of the state.

TRADE / BANKING

32. DBS Bank India expands bancassurance partnerships

DBS Bank India has expanded its bancassurance partnerships with two new partners in Tata AIA Life and Birla Sun Life, in addition to Aviva India Life.

33. Federal Bank launches new trading platform

Federal Bank, in association with Geojit, has launched a new trading platform called "Selfie" for customers.

34. Karnataka Bank, LIC ink pact

Karnataka Bank Ltd has entered into a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) of India for selling life insurance products of LIC.

- The bank signed the corporate agency agreement with LIC in Mangaluru.

35. HDFC Life launches India's first life insurance email bot

HDFC Life, one of India's leading private life insurance companies, announced the launch of India's first life insurance email bot.

- The email bot, named SPOK, can automatically read, understand, categorise, prioritise and respond to customer emails that are sent to HDFC Life, within milliseconds.
- This automation initiative will enable HDFC Life to respond to user queries faster and more efficiently and consistently.

36. Israel signs \$630 million arms deal with India

Israel and India penned a deal worth \$630 million, to provide India's navy with missile defence systems following a record weapons sale between the two countries last month.

- The new contract will see state-owned Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI) supply LRSAM air and missile defence systems for four Indian naval ships.
- IAI said the contract will be carried out with India's Bharat Electronics Limited, which will be the project's main contractor.
- LRSAM is an advanced air and missile defence system, jointly developed by IAI and India's Defence Research and Development Organisation.

37. SBI launches national hackathon 'Code For Bank'

State Bank of India (SBI) has launched a national hackathon for developers, start-ups and students to come up with innovative ideas and solutions for the banking sector.

38. India retains world's highest FDI recipient crown

India retained its numero uno position as the world's top most greenfield FDI investment destination for the second consecutive year, attracting USD 62.3 billion in 2016, says a report.

39. HDFC among top 10 consumer financial services companies globally

Mortgage lender HDFC Ltd is the only Indian company to be named among the top 10 consumer financial services companies in the world, with American Express claiming the first position.

- The company has been featured in the coveted list for the third consecutive year.
- American Express topped the list, followed by Capital One Financial and Visa in the second and third place, respectively.

APPOINTMENTS

40. DRDO chief S Christopher gets one-year extension

Eminent scientist S Christopher was given a one-year extension, till May next year, as chief of the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).

- Christopher is also Secretary, Department of Defence Research and Development (DoDRD). He will continue to hold both the charges for one more year.
- Christopher was in May 2015 appointed Director General of the DRDO for a two-year term.

41. Hassan Rouhani wins second term as Iran president

Iran's President Hassan Rouhani has been re-elected with an emphatic victory, official results show.

- Out of more than 40 million votes cast, he received 57%, defeating his main rival, a conservative cleric.
- Mr Rouhani, a moderate who agreed a deal with world powers to limit Iran's nuclear programme, pledged to remain true to his promises.

42. World Health Assembly elects new WHO Director-General

The Member States of WHO elected Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus as the new Director-General of WHO.

- Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus was nominated by the Government of Ethiopia, and will begin his five-year term on 1 July 2017.
- Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus will succeed Dr Margaret Chan, who has been WHO's

- Director-General since 1 January 2007.
- He will be the first health official from Africa to serve as director-general.
- Tedros is a former health and foreign affairs minister from Ethiopia.

43. PV Sindhu elected to BWF Athletes' Commission

Olympic silver medallist, PV Sindhu, led a trio of women onto the BWF Athletes' Commission as voting for four places on the representative body took place in Gold Coast, Australia.

- The Indian athlete topped the ballot with 129 votes with Kirsty Gilmour of Scotland placing third overall with 103 votes.

AWARDS

44. Indian-origin steel tycoon bags global award in UK

Britain's Indian-origin steel tycoon Sanjeev Gupta has bagged a top global award for his successful acquisitions and drive to transform the steel industry in the UK, India and beyond.

- Gupta, the executive chairman of the Liberty House Group received the title of 'CEO of the Year' at the prestigious Platts Global Metals Awards in London.

45. 2 Indian peacekeepers to be honored with UN Medal

Two Indian peacekeepers will be among 117 military, police and civilian personnel to be honored with a prestigious UN medal awarded posthumously for their courage and sacrifice in the line of duty.

- Rifleman Brijesh Thapa who served with the UN Organisation Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO) and Ravi Kumar who was deployed with the UN Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) will be honoured with the Dag Hammarskjold Medal on the International Day of UN Peacekeepers to be observed on May 24.

46. In tribute to Kalam, NASA names new species after him

Scientists at NASA have named a new organism discovered by them after former president and scientist APJ Abdul Kalam.

- Till date, the new organism—a form of a bacteria—has been found only on the International Space Station (ISS) and has not been found on earth.
- Researchers at the NASA for work on inter-planetary travel, discovered the new bacteria on the filters of the International Space Station (ISS) and named it Solibacillus kalamii to honour the late president.

47. Indian wins top intel science award in US

An Indian boy Prashant Ranganathan has won the world's largest pre-college science competition in the US in the environmental engineering category for his project on biodegradation of pesticides.

- Prashant Ranganathan, a 12th grader from Jamshedpur, along with over 20 high school students from various parts of India, participated in the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair.

48. Reliance Jio gets 'Digital Service Innovator of the Year Award'

Reliance Jio has received TM Forum's 'Digital Service Innovator of the Year Award' 2017.

- TM Forum is the industry association driving digital business transformation of the communications industry.
- Reliance Jio got this award by acquiring 90 million customers in four months.

49. 13-year-old Indian girl wins Asia yoga championship

Thirteen-year-old Vaishnavi of India beat hundreds of competitors to win the first Asia Level Yoga Competition.

- The competition, featuring teams from five nations, was held in Thailand on May 13 and 14.
- June 21 is International Day of Yoga. The U.N. designated the day on the urging of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi who said yoga lets people “discover the sense of oneness with yourself, the world, and the nature.”

50. Jacqueline Fernandez wins UK humanitarian award

Bollywood actor Jacqueline Fernandez received the International Humanitarian Award and writer Jeffrey Archer the Lifetime Achievement Award.

- Instituted by Asian Voice, a leading British Asian newsweekly, the “charity of the year” award was presented to Anxiety UK, which works to help people with anxiety disorders.
- Fernandez has teamed up with the charity Habitat for Humanity.
- Archer was given the Lifetime Achievement Award for services to various charity organisations over the years.

51. Cochin Port Trust bags Best Performance Awards from Ministry of Shipping

Cochin Port Trust has received two Best Performance Awards from Ministry of Shipping, one for achieving the highest growth in operating surplus and the other for achieving third highest growth in cargo traffic among the Major Ports in the year 2016-17.

- The Awards were received from Nitin Gadkari, Hon'ble Union Minister for Road Transport & Highways and Shipping by P Raveendran, Chairman and Shri A.V. Ramana, Dy. Chairman, Cochin Port Trust.
- Cochin Port Trust has registered the operating profit of Rs. 127.72 crores during 2016-17 as against Rs. 70.89 crores during 2015-16 recording a growth of 80%.

52. Young Indian cartoonist wins top conservation award

Rohan Chakravarty, a wildlife and environment cartoonist from India, has won this year's International President's Award for his efforts to change attitudes towards nature.

- The award is the top accolade given by World Wildlife Fund to recognise leadership in young conservationists who are under the age of 30 from around the world.

SPORTS

53. Federation Cup: Bengaluru FC beat Mohun Bagan 2-0 to win title

Bengaluru FC were crowned champions of the 38th edition of the Hero Federation Cup after they defeated Mohun Bagan 2-0 at the Barabati Stadium in Cuttack.

Points to Remember

- The Federation Cup, also known as Hero Federation Cup for sponsorship reasons, is an annual knockout style club football tournament in India that started in 1977.
- Mohun Bagan has lifted the Federation Cup for record 14 times.

54. Sweden beat Canada to win ice hockey world title

Sweden have won the ice hockey world championship, beating favourites Canada in a dramatic penalty shootout.

- The teams were tied at 1-1 after three periods in Cologne, Germany, with Victor Hedman scoring for the Swedes and Canada's Ryan O'Reilly equalising.

DEATHS

55. Mathunny Mathews aka 'Toyota' Sunny passes away

Mathunny Mathews popularly known as 'Toyota' Sunny, who was a pillar of the Indian expatriate community in Kuwait for over half-a-century, passed away at his residence in Qadisiya in Kuwait. He was 81.

56. Sir Roger Moore, James Bond actor, dies aged 89

Actor Sir Roger Moore, best known for playing James Bond, has died due to cancer aged 89.

- He played the famous spy in seven Bond films including Live and Let Die and A View to a Kill.
- Sir Roger was also well known for his humanitarian work - he was introduced to Unicef by the late Audrey Hepburn and was appointed as a goodwill ambassador in 1991.

BOOKS

57. PM releases 2 part book series on M.S. Swaminathan

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, has released a two-part book series on the eminent agricultural scientist Dr. M.S. Swaminathan.

- The series is titled - M.S. Swaminathan: The Quest for a world without hunger. Several Union Ministers and other dignitaries were present on the occasion.
- Praising the dedication and commitment of Prof. Swaminathan, the Prime Minister described him as a "Kisan Vaigyanik" – Farmers' Scientist; rather than just a "Krishi Vaigyanik" – Agricultural Scientist.

58. Union Home Minister releases the book 'India 2017 Yearbook'

The Union Home Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh has released the book 'India 2017 Yearbook' authored by the Union Home Secretary, Shri Rajiv Mehrishi.

- The CEO, NITI Aayog, Shri Amitabh Kant was also present on the occasion.
- The book was published by the Mc Graw Hill Education India.

59. Mann ki Baat, now a book

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's radio broadcast programme Mann ki Baat will be available in the form of a book now.

- Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe has written the preface for *Mann Ki Baat - A Social Revolution on Radio*, which will be presented to the President.
- The book is authored by NetCore founder and part time member of the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) Rajesh Jain.
- It is being released on May 26 at Rashtrapati Bhawan with the first copy to be presented to President Pranab Mukherjee.

60. Kiren Rijju unveils world's first philosophical novel on God

Young Indian IAS officer, Haulianlal Guite, who hails from country's most remote areas of Manipur state has recently published a book titled "Confessions of a dying mind: the blind faith of atheism" in New Delhi.

- The book was unveiled by Union Minister Kiren Rijju in presence of David Syiemlieth, Chairman, UPSC.
- The book billed as "the world's first philosophical novel for God", whose author is arguably the first Indian civil servant to write on philosophy since John Stuart Mill published On Liberty way back in 1858.

61. President to receive book written by Uday Mahurkar

The President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee will receive the first copy of book 'Marching with a Billion- Analysing Narendra Modi's Government at Midterm' from Smt. Sumitra Mahajan, Speaker Lok Sabha.

- The book 'Marching with a Billion- Analysing Narendra Modi's Government at Midterm' written by eminent journalist Shri Uday Mahurkar analyses the monumental changes that Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has brought on multiple fronts.

62. New Book on Virat Kohli's Winning Formula Revealed by Abhirup Bhattacharya
