- John Alfred Tinniswood, a 111-year-old Englishman from Southport, northwest England, has officially been named the world's oldest living man by Guinness World Records.
- This recognition comes after the passing of the previous record holder, Juan Vicente Pérez of Venezuela, at the age of 114, and Gisaburo Sonobe from Japan, at the age of 112 are died.
- Tinniswood attributes his remarkable longevity to a combination of luck, moderation, and a weekly indulgence in fish and chips.

Simon Harris becomes Ireland's youngest Prime Minister

- Simon Harris, aged 37, has been elected as Ireland's youngest-ever prime minister.
- Harris succeeds Leo Varadkar, who became Ireland's youngest-ever leader at 38 and its first openly gay prime minister.
- Harris, a former health and higher education minister, secured the nomination with a vote of 88-69 in parliament, garnering support from independent lawmakers, as well as his coalition partners Fianna Fail and the Green Party.
- Harris's rise within the Fine Gael party has been rapid. Joining its youth branch at 16, he became a county councillor at 22 and entered parliament at 24, earning him the nickname "Baby of the Dail."

Scientists investigate thousands of dead Antarctic penguins for bird flu

- Researchers are seeking to find out a scientific expedition last month that at least 532 dead Adelie penguins, with thousands more thought to have died, according to a statement from Federation University Australia.
- > While the researchers suspect the deadly H5N1 bird flu virus killed the penguins, the field tests were inconclusive.
- Samples are being shipped off to labs that the researchers hope will provide answers in coming months.
- Scientists are concerned specifically that the often fatal H5N1 influenza could decimate threatened species of penguins and other animals on the remote southern continent.
- The disease has spread more aggressively in wildlife than ever before since arriving in South America in 2022 and rapidly made its way to Antarctica, where the first case of H5N1 was confirmed in February.

Athletic Bilbao end a wait of 40 years to win Copa del Rey

- Athletic Bilbao broke a 40-year spell by clinching the Copa del Rey title in a thrilling penalty shootout victory against Real Mallorca.
- In a showdown at La Cartuja stadium in Seville, the Basque squad claimed their 24th trophy, trailing only behind Barcelona's 31 titles, by narrowly overcoming the underdog challenge from Mallorca.
- The match saw Dani Rodriguez putting Mallorca in the lead in the first half, swiftly countered by Oihan Sancet's equalizer after the break, leading to a deadlock until the decisive penalty shootout.
- Julen Agirrezabala, Athletic's goalkeeper, emerged as a hero by thwarting Manu Morlanes' penalty, while Nemanja Radonjic's miss from the spot further favored Athletic, who converted all four of their penalties to clinch victory.
- Alex Berenguer sealed the triumph with a composed finish from the spot, igniting euphoric celebrations among the traveling Basque supporters.
- For Ernesto Valverde's Athletic, who had previously faced six defeats in the final, this hard-earned victory marked the end of a series of near misses.

Physicist Peter Higgs passed away

- British physicist Peter Higgs, whose theory of a mass-giving particle is called Higgs boson jointly earned him the Nobel Prize for Physics, has died aged 94.
- ➢ Higgs used ground-breaking theoretical work to help explain how the Universe has mass, thus resolving one of the greatest puzzles in physics and earning him a place alongside Albert Einstein and Max Planck in textbooks.
- His 1964 theory of a mass-giving particle, which became known as the Higgs boson or the "God particle", won him and Belgian physicist Francois Englert the 2013 physics Nobel Prize.
- That followed experiments at the Large Hadron Collider at the European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN) finally confirming the theory the previous year, nearly half a century on.
- → Higgs was born in Newcastle, England in 1929 and studied at King's College, University of London.

- As a coach, Harendra started his career with Indian men's hockey in 1997. Under his game, India has won 11 gold medals including the 2016 men's junior World Cup, 2017 women's Asia Cup and 2018 Asian Champions Trophy (men).

The WHO report states that India is second after China in the cases of Hepatitis B and C

- According to a World Health Organization (WHO) report, India had the second highest number of hepatitis B and C cases after China with 35 million infections in 2022.
- > Hepatitis is an inflammation of the liver that can cause a variety of health problems and can be fatal.
- Globally, 254 million people were infected with hepatitis B, and 50 million were infected with hepatitis C in 2022, according to WHO's 2024 Global Hepatitis Report.
- In terms of viral hepatitis, India was second after China, with 29.8 million hepatitis B cases in 2022 and 5.5 million hepatitis C infections.
- China has recorded 83 million cases of hepatitis B and C, accounting for 27.5% of the total disease burden.

- According to the report, India accounted for 11.6% of the total disease burden globally that year with a total of 35 million cases.
- > There are **five main types** of hepatitis viruses, called types **A**, **B**, **C**, **D**, **and E**.
- Although they all cause liver disease, they differ in important ways, including methods of transmission, severity of disease, geographic distribution, and methods of prevention.
- The report released at the World Hepatitis Summit in Portugal and 3,500 people are dying globally due to hepatitis B and C infection every day.
- ➢ WHO has set a target to eliminate Hepatitis worldwide by 2030.



- A 12-member team led by Maj. Aditya Karki will start their journey from the base camp on April 14.

India achieves target to eliminate visceral leishmaniasis 'Kala-Azar'

- India has achieved its target to eliminate visceral leishmaniasis, commonly known as kala-azar, according to data from the National Centre for Vector Borne Diseases Control (NCVBDC).
- ➤ India had initially aimed to eliminate kala-azar by 2010, but the target was extended until 2023 due to persistent challenges.
- Kala-azar, a vector-borne disease caused by protozoan parasites transmitted through sandfly bites, has posed a significant health challenge for decades, particularly in states like Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, and Uttar Pradesh.
- The latest data from NCVBDC indicates that India reported only 520 cases of kala-azar in 2023 across India, meeting the elimination criteria set by the World Health Organization (WHO), which defines elimination as no block in the country reporting more than one case per 10,000 people.

- As per the WHO, in 2020, India accounted for 18 per cent of the global burden of kala-azar. The elimination has come after government interventions, including indoor spraying to kill sandflies, sealing potential breeding sites, and mobilising healthcare workers to ensure proper treatment completion.
- In addition to kala-azar, the data also reveals the HIV-VL coinfection and post-kala-azar dermal leishmaniasis (PKDL) cases in India.
- While progress has been made, challenges persist, particularly in states like Bihar and Jharkhand, where cases of PKDL remain relatively high.

India's Jagjit Pavadia re-elected to International

- India's nominee Ms. Jagjit Pavadia was elected by the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) as a member of the *International Narcotics Control Board (INCB)* for the third term from 2025-2030.
- > India was also elected to key UN bodies such as the Commission on the Status of Women for the term for 2025-2029.
- The ExecutivSe Board of the United Nations Children's Fund, the Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund/United Nations Office for Project Services, the Executive Board of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women, and the Executive Board of the World Food Programme for the term 2025-2027.

A rare butterfly species named Neptis philyra has been recently discovered in Arunachal Pradesh

- A rare butterfly species named Neptis philyra, commonly known as long-streak sailor, has been discovered for the first time in India in Tale Valley Wildlife Sanctuary in Arunachal Pradesh.
- Till date, the butterfly species was known to be found across various regions of East Asia, including Siberia, Korea, Japan, Central and South East Asia.
- > The butterfly has serrated wings with rich brownish-black on the upper side and yellow-brown on the underside.
- > The butterfly's distinct markings include a white cell streak forming a "hockey stick" pattern on the forewing.
