WHO defines Pathogens that transmit through air

- World Health Organization (WHO) declared that Pathogens transmit through the air will be called 'infectious respiratory particles'.
- WHO has updated terminology for pathogens and the main aim of the change is to help in identifying, and respond to existing and new airborne pathogens.
- At present, there is no common terminology to describe the transmission of these pathogens, which was particularly challenging during the global COVID-19 pandemic.
- The announcement on after the wide-ranging consultations across multiple steps in 2021-2023.
- As per the new definition, all particles expelled from the mouth or nose of an infected person, regardless of size, are called "infectious respiratory particles" or IRPs.

The pathogens covered include those that cause respiratory infections, e.g. COVID-19, influenza, measles, Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS), Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS), and tuberculosis.



World Population Report 2024: UNFPA

- ➤ The United Nations Population Fund's (UNFPA) World Population 2024 report revealed that India's population is estimated to double in 77 years.
- ➤ India leads globally with an estimated population of 1.44 billion (144 cr), followed by China at 1.425 billion.
- India's population was recorded at **1.21 billion** during the last census, conducted in **2011**.



- The report revealed that 24% were aged 0-14, 17% aged 10-19, and 26% aged 10-24. 68% aged 15-64, and 7% aged 65 and above.
- Men have a life expectancy of 71 years and women 74 years.
- The report also highlighted that 30 years of India's progress in sexual and reproductive health has largely ignored the most marginalised communities globally.
- The percentage of **child marriage** in India was at **23% between 2006-2023.**
- Maternal deaths in India have significantly decreased, making up 8% of global maternal fatalities.
- The report highlights that maternal mortality is high among indigenous groups. Women with disabilities are more vulnerable to gender-based violence.
- India's **640 districts** revealed that while nearly a **third achieved** the sustainable development goal of reducing maternal mortality ratio below 70 per 100,000 live births, 114 districts still have ratios of 210 or more.
- Vulnerable groups face greater sexual and reproductive health risks, exacerbated by factors like climate change and caste-based discrimination.

A fine of Rs 60.3 lakhs imposed by RBI on 5 cooperative banks for violating rules

- A fine of **Rs 43.30 lakh** has been imposed on **Rajkot Nagrik Sahakari Bank** for non-compliance with RBI instructions.
- RBI has 'prohibited granting of loans and advances to directors and their relatives and firms in which they have interest' and 'prohibited opening of savings bank accounts in the name of certain organizations'.
- A monetary penalty of Rs 5 lakh each has been imposed by the central bank on The Kangra Co-operative Bank (New Delhi), Rajdhani Nagar Co-operative Bank (Lucknow), and District Co-operative Bank, Garhwal (Kotdwar, Uttarakhand).
- Apart from this, a fine of **Rs 2lakh** has been imposed on **the District Cooperative Bank (Dehradun).**
- In each case, the RBI said the penalty is based on deficiencies in regulatory compliance.
- ➤ It is not intended to affect the validity of any transaction entered into by the banks with their respective customers.

- The launch event was attended by former IAS officer Dr Jayaprakash Narayan, former ASCI chairman K. Padamanabhaiah and former RBI Governor Dr D. Subba Rao.
- This book shows plea for a new, resurgent India. It's a call to arms for all those who refuse to accept the status quo and demand a brighter future for our nation.



India delivers first batch of BrahMos supersonic missiles to Philippines

- India delivered **the first batch of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles** to the **Philippines**, in reflection of the growing military ties between the two countries amid China's military muscle-flexing in the South China Sea.
- The supplies came over two years India signed a \$375 million deal with the Southeast Asian nation to supply the weapon systems.
- ➤ **A C-17 Globemaster transport aircraft** of the Indian Air Force (IAF) transported the missile and the launchers to the Philippines for the country's marine forces.
- > It was the **first export of the BrahMos missile** by India.
- A few other countries including **Argentina** have also shown interest in procuring BrahMos missiles from India.



- **BrahMos Aerospace Pvt Ltd**, an **India-Russian joint venture**, produces the supersonic cruise missiles that can be launched from submarines, ships, aircraft, or land platforms.
- ▶ BrahMos missile flies at a speed of 2.8 Mach or almost three times the speed of sound.
- > The twin sides are also favouring implementation of an arbitral award by a UN court on the South China Sea.
- As part of efforts to boost military ties with the Philippines, India has decided to post a defence attache to that country along with Ethiopia, Mozambique, Poland and Ivory Coast.

Rajiv Gauba to head central government committee on LGBTQ + community

- The government of India has set up a **committee on LGBTQ+ communities**' welfare headed by Union Home Secretary **Rajiv Gauba.**
- The committee has been set up by the government on the suggestion of the Supreme Court in the **Supriyo Chakraborty** vs Union of India Case.
- In the Supriyo Chakraborty vs. Union of India Case 2023, **the Special Marriage Act of 1954** was challenged because it did not permit **same-sex marriage**.
- The plaintiffs argued that this was **against Article 14** of **the fundamental rights, which provides for equal protection** of law.



- Under the **Special Marriage Act of 1954**, people of different religions can marry. The marriage is legally recognized by the government and is registered before the designated authority within India or abroad.
- ➤ If a Hindu wants to marry a Muslim, the marriage can be done under the Special Marriage Act without changing their religion.
- In India, there is no uniform civil code. There are separate personal laws for different religions.
- The Hindu Marriage Act 1954 applies to Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, and Buddhists. Similarly, the Indian Christian Marriage Act of 1872 applies to Christians, the Muslim Personal Law (Shariat) Application Act of 1937 applies to Muslims, and the Parsi Marriage and Divorce Act of 1936 applies to the Parsi community.
- The six-member committee will be headed by Union Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba and include secretaries of important ministries like:
- Social Justice and Empowerment Secretary Saurabh Garg as convenor and Secretary from the Home Affairs, Women and Child Development, Health and Family Welfare, and Law and Justice ministries.
- **LGBTQ**+ is a collective term which represents a personal sexual orientation or identity.
- The term include les-bian, gay, bisex-u-al, transgender, queer, inter-sex, asex-u-al and other identities. They are also sometimes called as **Queer.**




European astronomers find Milky Way's largest Stellar-mass black hole

European astronomers discovered the largest stellar black hole in our galaxy. It is 2,000 light years away from Earth. The mass of this black hole named 'BH-3' is 33 times more than the Sun.

About ESA's Gaia Space Observatory discovered 'BH-3':

- The weight of many stellar black holes previously found in the galaxy is 10 times the mass of the Sun. For the first time, a massive black hole has been detected.
- **BH-3'** was discovered by the Gaia Space Observatory of the European Space Agency (ESA).
- ➤ The Gaia Space Telescope was launched in the year **2013**.
- Scientists came to know of 'BH-3' when they observed flexibility in the rotation of a star in the 'Aquila' constellation. This star revolves around a giant black hole.

- > Scientists estimate that there may be **one billion stellar black holes** like 'BH-3' in **the galaxy.**
- ➤ However, it is very difficult to find them, because most stellar black holes do not have any stars revolving around them.
- This is the **second black hole** discovered so far, which is the closest to Earth.
- According to scientists, 'BH-3' originated from the destruction of a **giant star.** Some black holes are formed by the collapse of huge clouds of dust and gas.
- Sagittarius A*' is one such black hole, which is present in the center of the galaxy. It is the largest non-stellar black hole, with a mass four million times that of the Sun.

About formation of black holes:

- When a star with more than eight times the mass of the Sun runs out of fuel, it undergoes a supernova explosion, causing its core to collapse and become a stellar black hole.
- ➤ Black holes were **first discovered** by **Karl Schwarzschild** and **John Wheeler**.

Santhosh Viswanathan appointed as Managing Director of Intel India

- Computer chip maker **Intel** announced **Santhosh Viswanathan** will head the India region business as its **Managing Director (MD).** Viswanathan has been with Intel for about 21 years.
- In **March** this year, **Intel** announced **India as a separate region** within its SMG (Sales, Marketing and Communications Group) organisation, to capitalise on the country's rapid growth and business opportunities.
- Viswanathan took charge as **Vice President and Managing Director** for the Indian market in **July 2022**. Now Intel has formed India as a separate region.
- The company also announced the appointment of Hans Chuang as General Manager (GM) of SMG Asia Pacific and Japan (APJ).

Based out of Taiwan, Hans will be responsible for Intel's overall business in the APJ region, including driving revenue growth, engaging with the local ecosystem to create new opportunities, and strengthening existing customer and partner relationships.

India and the US plan to restart the Indian Ocean Observing System (IndOOS)

- India and the US plan to restart the Indian Ocean Observing System (IndOOS), a network of 36 buoys stationed in the high seas.
- These buoys will collect detailed data on ocean and atmospheric conditions to help improve weather forecasts.
- The **IndOOS** array of buoys, which is a crucial source of weather data, was neglected and fell into disrepair during the COVID-19 pandemic.



- This resulted in a lack of observational data, which is essential for weather forecasters. This is especially important since the Indian Ocean Dipole phenomenon is connected to the monsoon.
- To address this issue, **M Ravichandran**, the Earth Sciences Secretary, discussed with **Rick Spinrad**, the Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) of the US, about reactivating the IndOOS.
- The moored buoys are part of the Research Moored Array for African-Asian-Australian Monsoon Analysis and Prediction (RAMA) programme, which was established in 2008 through a collaboration between the Ministry of Earth Sciences and NOAA.
- NOAA has agreed to provide instrumentation, while India will provide ship-time starting from July to restart the RAMA program. The process will require about **60-90 days of ship-time**.
- The RAMA moored buoys need to be replaced annually because the sensors become less accurate and the batteries run out.
- This maintenance is usually done by research vessels from **Indonesia**, **India and South Korea**, in collaboration with NOAA.
- Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, these research cruises were suspended for over two years. Only one servicing cruise was able to turn around two buoys in the southwest Indian Ocean in January 2022.

Meta unveils Llama 3 and real-time image generator

- Meta released its latest large language model Llama 3 and a real-time image generator.
- Its main objective is to fill the gap with **OpenAI** in the rapidly evolving field of artificial intelligence (AI).
- The newly unveiled models will be integrated into Meta's virtual assistant- Meta AI.
- Meta's Llama 3 is the latest in its Llama series of **open-source AI models.**
- > It came in two versions: one with 8 billion parameters and a second with 70 billion parameters.
- The models are trained on sequences of 8,192 tokens. It grouped query attention (GQA) for both the 8B and 70B parameter models.
- The incorporation of image data into Llama 3's training holds promise for Meta's upcoming product, the **Ray-Ban Meta smart glasses**, enabling the AI assistant to identify objects and provide relevant information to users.

- The board of Aditya Birla Fashion and Retail (ABRFL) has approved the proposal of a vertical demerger of Madura Fashion and Lifestyle (MFL) business into a newly incorporated entity named as Aditya Birla Lifestyle Brands (ABLB).
- ABFRL also plans to raise **Rs 2,500 crore** equity capital within **12 months** of demerger with promoter participation.
- The demerger will be implemented through the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) scheme of arrangement, and upon its completion, all shareholders of ABFRL will have identical shareholdings in both the companies.

The move is triggered by need to boost stagnant valuation and reverse losses seen during FY24 amid higher investment

into newer businesses.
